# President's Report - Mary Anderson

I am honored to have served this past year as President of your Board of Directors. It has been a busy year resulting in many accomplishments. I especially want to thank the Executive Committee: Dave Sanderson, Vice President, Norm Kolstad, Secretary, David Wass, Treasurer and John Miersch, Past President. The Executive Committee meets monthly prior to the Board meeting. Our early discussion helps expedite matters so when the full board meets: the five of us, plus Stan Carignan, Alisha Piekarski, Connie Stigen, Kris Warhol, Bob Worner and administrative Consultant, JoAnn Larson, we can move more quickly through the decision-making process. The Finance Committee comprised of the Executive Committee, the Stewardship Committee and our two book-keepers also meet on a quarterly basis to assure that we were staying in line with our budget and collection projections.

You'll remember that at last year's annual meeting, we were still giving consideration on whether to purchase the Sverdrup Suite Apartment complex next door. With your approval, we moved ahead with that purchase. The purchase went smoothly and we have been receiving regular rent each month. We continue to wait for a vacancy so that we can carry out expansion plans for Children's activities, meetings, office and storage areas. Meantime, we make the best use of the space we have here at church.

This past year, we lost some beloved members; we worry now about others with special cares and concerns; and we have gained new members. Next week we will have a celebration to honor our volunteers – because in this lay-led congregation of 92 voting members, it is you, who volunteer for the many responsibilities making us who we are and what we do.

The Board makes periodic contacts with voting members to get feedback and we consider what you tell us – both the positives and the negatives so that we can maintain or act to improve.

There is one accomplishment that I'm especially proud of. It took many emails, much review and work but we are most pleased to have at last one document, the UCU Policy and Procedures Manual. This is a compilation of our by-laws, strategic plans, organizational structure, the roles, responsibilities of all our committees, the policies and procedures, operational plans and forms. This information had previously floated between heads, drawers, houses and bodies. It took some tracking down and added work to fill in the blanks by the Board and the various committees. Thanks to the many hours of Norm Kolstad, this manual along with other historical and current UCU records, are now stored electronically on Google Docs, another major accomplishment. We have been giving you links to some of those documents in the Newsletter. Our use of technology continues to expand.

From the time I started herein 2007, I hear mumblings about the noise level in the lower level. Look around you. We have at last installed attractive, sound absorbing acoustic panels. Yay team!! (Katy, Tere, Connie, Duane, Ron, Mary, Diana). This was just one of the efforts of Facilities to maintain this beautiful building.

In the way of program: our speaker's committee brings us a variety of quality speakers each week on a wide range of subjects, adult religious education classes are held on all 4 of the Sundays - all of which lift our spirits, inspire and educate us. The U Groups fill the need for smaller, more intimate gatherings to exchange ideas and support each other.

Through community outreach, we extend into the community through special events, fundraisers, social and environmental justice actions - all a part of who we are - active and visible and making a difference in many areas.

Plans are underway to host our 2<sup>nd</sup> UU Area Fall Workshop with the dates of October 20-21 for a ½ day MUUSJA workshop and full day exchange among the 10-11 other UU churches we're inviting. Don't forget to mark your calendars – We're going to need lots of volunteers!!

You will find out through the many reports today, the steady stream of communications coming your way through enhanced social media and other means, that we are an active, vibrant community of individuals seeking truth, justice, compassion who BELONG here at the Unitarian Church of Underwood.

I and every Board member are here to hear you. We welcome your input and do our best to put your ideas into action. We celebrate that we've done much and we know there will be more we can do as a church, in this community and as individuals in the communities where we live.

## **Stewardship Committee Report – Dave Sanderson**

- 1. The Stewardship Committee informed the congregation about the status of the UCU's operating budget and revenues through quarterly reports at Sunday services. Our collections increased from \$35,000 to \$42,481, a greater than 20% increase. The annual budget was \$42,515.
- 2. An Estimate of Giving Form was distributed to members to encourage giving financially and through time and talent.
- 3. Last year a system was developed that allows members to do direct payment from their checking account to the UCU account. This helps make revenues more predictable and steady throughout the year. Several members are using this payment system and we encourage everyone to consider it.

# **UCU Foundation Advisory Committee – Dave Sanderson**

The UCU Foundation Advisory Committee oversees the operation of the UCU foundation and advises the Board of Directors regarding the Foundation structure, management and operation. The UCU Foundation Advisory Committee met 6 times in 2016-17. Committee activities included:

- Testimonials were conducted by committee members during UCU services informing the congregation about the Foundation and describing why it is important to consider making contributions or bequests.
- The Committee produced 2 separate brochures to promote the UCU Foundation
- Currently Foundation members are meeting one-on-one with UCU members or friends
  of UCU to educate and promote the Foundation using the 2 brochures, the Foundation
  Bequest form, the Foundation bequest acceptance policy and a bequest terminology
  list. To date the committee has met with approximately 1/3 of the UCU membership.

 Dave Sanderson has attended several UUCEF Webinars to update himself and the committee with the investment activity of the UUCEF, which prides itself in participating in socially responsible investments which coincides with the principles of the UCU.

Connie Stigen will maintain a list to avoid making multiple contacts with individuals. All bequests are stored in a safety deposit box in Farmer's State- Underwood, Mn. Confidentiality is strictly maintained to protect the privacy of those who make bequests and/or contributions.

To date the UCU Foundation has received and accepted a \$5,000.00 contribution that was deposited in a separate UCU Foundation account with the UUCEF.

A budget was submitted for \$250.00 to cover paper and printing expenses.

# **Membership Committee – Mary Anderson**

Membership committee members make special efforts to welcome and acquaint ourselves with first time and follow-up visitors. JoAnn maintains the visitor and new member packets. JoAnn also makes sure cards are set out for signing for members/friends with care or concerns. In addition to the cards, Mary Anderson and JoAnn do a lot of emailing to newcomers or those we haven't seen in a while or those who we give special recognition.

For care and concerns: We tracked that at least 40 cards were sent when signed by the membership; we know that many visits are made by friends to friends experiencing difficulties. We follow up with phone calls or emails to those who we miss or are unable to come regularly. We have several members who regularly visit friends who are ailing or shut-in and sometimes we call upon others with a connection just to alert them that there is a friend who might like a visit or call. Other helps are given when requested.

We received one new members at the welcoming ceremony in October, 2016 and two at the March 2017 welcoming ceremony. Already, another couple has signed the membership book in April with several more contemplating membership.

The Membership Committee reviewed and updated the active membership list and recommended to the Board that 65 members be certified for UUA and MidAmerica Region for Fair Share assessment per the certified member criteria established (counting one/household). That assessment is \$60/member to the UUA and \$25/member for the region. \$85/certified member/year equals \$5225 or 12% of our 2017-18 budget. In fact, the voting member list as of today includes 92 individual members, most of whom are actively involved in one or more capacities. We also maintain a contact list that includes less active members and many friends. Thanks to Jo for maintaining these lists.

We completed our objective for this year by producing and distributing an updated Church Directory. We didn't have permission or contact to include all of the UCU members and friends so that's why not everyone is included. We are preparing for a volunteer appreciation event next week. The membership committee will provide the pasta dinner and we have some other surprises. So, we're looking forward to seeing you all there!

Attendance taken 48 Sundays – Average attendance 45/Sunday. Range from low of 21 (wind chill Sunday in December) to high of 70 (Sunday after election).

# **Communications Committee – Mary Anderson**

This is a newly formed committee responsible for the electronic record keeping system for archived and current church records, maintaining the website and Facebook Page, producing the weekly church reports and the monthly newsletter, producing church bulletins and media announcements. The purpose is to make information more easily accessible and to increase UCU visibility through greater social media presence.

Efforts and roles evolved when we were seeking to put the policies and procedures manual online. That effort resulted in setting up an electronic record-keeping system using Google Docs. Norm Kolstad then transferred many/most of the UCU archived and current records to this safer and securer storage file. Norm will now act as Google Docs Administrator.

With the addition of members/friends with increased technical skills, Bonnie Showers took on the UCU Facebook page. Ellen continues to administrate the website and does the electronic mailings of the church report and newsletters. Melony Shores will likely take on the responsibilities of website enhancements. Mary Anderson with the help of Stephanie Sanderson produces the monthly newletters, or as Ellen calls them, the monthly "Magazine." JoAnn continues to do the Sunday bulletin and gets out media announcements when needed.

A future project will be to work with the Technical Team to make Sunday talks available electronically.

The Celebrants have been speaking during UCU Sunday services once a month, usually on the first Sunday of the month, with Bob speaking every other month. The other services are taken by Katy, Ellen, Shannon and John. The Celebrants meet regularly to study together. # **Adult Religious Education**

1st Sundays: "We, the group, decided last fall to read and discuss the book, "The New Jim Crow." In doing so, we have found the book highly informative and thought provoking. We have had good discussions around topics raised by, or at least tangential to the book (we certainly seem to have "tangent-prone" people in our church!). Everyone who has attended has concerns that the racial problems in this country require not only thought and study but real attention and action. At least for me, that is true. These problems need to be dealt with and solved – which if we are serious about it, will probably require the time and resources of everyone in this country. It is almost certainly going to hurt.

Attendance of this class has been steady – with an average of eight people each Sunday. Everyone who attends has been an active participant.

We usually make that decision for next year's topic in the spring when we wrap up for the year or in the fall when we start anew." John Minge, Leader

2<sup>nd</sup> Sundays: Sandy Barnhouse led Ancient Religions.

**4<sup>th</sup> Sundays**: "An average of six people attended the monthly class on the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of each month. This past year, we studied the latest book by John Shelby Spong, *Biblical Literalism: A Gentile Heresy*. Spong is convinced that Atonement Theology (that Jesus was a sacrificial lamb who died for our sins), is not congruent with Jewish thinking at that time. Spong thinks it would be a 'barbaric act of genocide' for God to have his own son killed and that God's love is sufficient for all of us. Those in class are excellent contributors to all discussions." *Bob Worner, Leader*.

# Mindfulness/Quaker Quiet Time Sitting

"The Mindfulness/Quaker Quiet Time Sitting Group met the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday every month, to include the summer months. While attendance is not taken, we average about 6 people each month from about a dozen who participate in any given month.

We meet at 9:00 during the fall/winter/spring in the Frances Ellison Room upstairs. Most participants sit on chairs, with a few sitting on the floor on a cushion. Sitting in silence lasts for 30 minutes. It is preceded by a short reading to quiet the mind. The session begins with one

bell ring from the singing bowl. Three rings end the session. The silent time is followed by an unstructured discussion. Participants may bring up anything that is on their mind or has arisen from the silence.

We intend to continue meeting this summer. When the summer service schedule shifts to 9:30, we will shift our start time to 8:00.
