## Programming Annual Report for 2014 – 2015

Programming's strategic goal is to "attend to the spiritual needs of members by providing a broad range of opportunities for personal reflection, discussion, intellectual stimulation, artistic expression, and social interaction." Each of the parts of Programming work toward that goal by meeting more specific objectives that were formed through the participation of everyone in the congregation.

#### Speaker's Committee Report – by Betsy Wells, Chair of Speaker's Committee

The UCU Sunday Speaker Committee met most of the goals adopted by the board for the 2014-2015 season. The programs featured a variety of topics and speakers – including UU ministers; UU lay speakers; music performances; philosophy; science issues; social justice issues; and literary topics. We continue to pursue possible "high profile" speakers/programs but find this difficult (because of cost, availability, attempting to coordinate with other groups, etc.). We have kept the process open – through a system of referrals, follow-ups to suggestions, and quarterly surveys. The surveys have given us feedback about Sunday programs as well as general information regarding topics of interest. Information about upcoming speakers is featured in the monthly UCU newsletter, Sunday bulletin, Facebook, and at least once a month in the FF Daily Journal. Bob Worner has involved the celebrants as speakers/moderators in 6 Sunday programs, and he spoke at 7 services.

The congregation has been actively involved in services including the May 25 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary panel of longtime members; the June 29 program at Phelps Mill, the December 14 drumming program led by Doris Issendorf; and the December 21 Winter Holiday Celebration. The children have been involved in a couple of services including the Winter Celebration. The Writers group has been involved in a couple of programs.

Many thanks to this year's committee members: JoAnn Larson, Bob Worner, Stan Carignan, Kris Warhol, Lowell Carpenter, Diane Johnson, and Betsy Wells. We are open to having new members.

#### Children's Religious Education (RE) Report - by Betsy Wells and JoAnn Larson

JoAnn Larson and Betsy Wells have coordinated the Religious Education program for children. We have met once a month; the date is determined by the convenience for the majority of the families involved.

JoAnn has worked with the younger kids (ages 1-6<sup>th</sup> grade). The monthly focus (per parent consensus), during the fall, 2014 to spring, 2015 has been exposure to the world religions represented on the diagram/artwork at the front of the sanctuary.

Betsy Wells, along with John Minge have worked with the teens. Most of their focus has been on developing a Coming of Age program. This program will continue in the next fiscal year.

#### Adult Religious Education (RE)

We offered three different Adult RE classes. John Minge led a monthly discussion of the writing of Emerson, meeting on the first Sunday of the month. Bob Worner led a study of the book of John using Spong's book on John, the mystic, meeting the fourth Sunday of the month.

The spiritual writing group has taken a different form as the year progressed. See following.

#### Spiritual Writing Group Report – by Diane Johnson

Our spiritual writing group decided to "re-group!" Since we are all members of the Fergus Falls Writers Group, we meet regularly and it began to seem as if we were duplicating our focus. However, we would like to continue in a different manner and provide a program three times a year. Betsy and I decided that it would be a good idea if, instead of searching for a random topic, we selected one of the principles each time to write about. So, beginning in August (date to be decided), we will be using the first principle as our guideline - "The inherent worth and dignity of every person."

#### **U-Groups**

Our U-Groups will complete their fourth year in May, 2015. There were four groups this year, each with a pair of co-facilitators. The hosts were Ross and Mary Larson; Mary Anderson, Sandy Barnhouse, and Diana Ziesemer.

Tere Mann and Connie Stigen are co-leaders of the U-Group facilitators. Facilitators receive orientation and training during the summer, and meet monthly September through May for additional training and planning.

#### **Outreach Report**

We consider anything that happens outside of the Unitarian Church of Underwood (UCU) building Outreach. (U-Groups are the exception.) This year there were quite a few outreach activities that took place.

Adopt A Highway – UCU has adopted a two mile stretch of highway on County Road 1 just west of County Road 35. We are responsible for picking up trash in the ditches each spring and fall. After the ditches are finished we gather together for a potluck supper.

God's Work, Our Hands – Each year Sverdrup Lutheran Church in Underwood participates in the ELCA event God's Work, Our Hands, during which community service projects our done. This year members of UCU participated with Sverdrup. We have been invited to participate again in 2015.

Community Thanksgiving Service – Several years ago, we collaborated with Sverdrup Lutheran Church to provide a Community Thanksgiving Service held at the Underwood High School. It has become an annual event. Several of our members have given short talks about gratitude, along with members from Sverdrup. Our musicians also participate in the service.

CHILI SUPPER FUNDRAISER A "SUCCESS" - This was the 11<sup>th</sup> year of the Chili Fundraiser for the Underwood Senior Nutrition Program. This was the first year in many that Ron Roller did not head it up. John Minge and Dave McRoberts were the main organizers. There were a couple of changes with the chili verities offered, and the new types of chili appeared to go over well. Wally Warhol and Keith Peterson helped with the cooking and perpetration the night before the Supper. Many people from our church volunteered to sell the 200 tickets printed, at \$9 each, in advance. The price at the door was \$10 each. Promotion material and tickets were arranged by JoAnn Larson along with a lot of other work JoAnn completed behind the scenes. We had around 155 people attend the event on Friday March 27<sup>th.</sup> Many church members (about 20) helped with facilitating the event. Expenses were around \$600 for everything. I believe we raised around \$1200 once all the ticket money and other donations are in and bills paid. This amount is to be determined, and then profits donated to the Senior Nutrition Program. All in all it was a great success with wonderful community participation. I look forward to the opportunity of doing it next year. John and I have already started to plan for 2016! Empowerment Grants - Empowerment Grants 2015-2016 Approved by UCU Board The 2015-2016 Unitarian Church of Underwood Empowerment Grants were just approved by the UCU Board on the recommendation of the Grant Committee. Nine applications totaling over \$15,700 were submitted for this year's empowerment grants to compete for the \$9,000 the UCU Board had approved for annual funding. Ron Roller, Community Outreach Committee Chair said that it was difficult for the committee to determine award amounts but in an effort to be fair and make the funds go around, all got some, but none all that they asked for. #### **Membership Committee Report**

Either Membership Committee members, Perham U Group members or other volunteers have served as upstairs and downstairs greeters each Sunday service. Membership committee members make special efforts to welcome visitors, hand out visitor packets and greet visitors by name at their future visits.

At least 40 cards were sent, either signed at coffee hour by church attendees or signed "Your UCU Friends," and sent. At least twenty phone calls were made to members with special concerns, at least 24 personal visits were counted that were made to members with needs and 4 meals were provided. After identifying members with special needs, requests were made to U Group Facilitators who then followed up with members with special needs from their groups. We do try to maintain a tracking list but don't always catch all the supports given.

The Membership Committee reviewed the updated/current active membership list and recommended to the Board that 61 members be certified for the UUA Fair Share assessment per the certified member criteria established last year.

We received five new members, four of whom were welcomed at a ceremony March 15, 2015. Most commented that they liked UCU because they felt welcomed and included.

Visitor and New Member packets were replenished because stocks had been depleted through handouts. 10 additional directories were purchased because the original supply had been depleted.

The Membership Committee plans to coordinate another progressive dinner later in the year and will recommend that Board members again make phone calls to each member/friend sometime during the fiscal year.

# 1889- 2014 Celebrating 125 Years 2015 Annual Meeting Report April 15, 2015

The Unitarian Church of Underwood in 2014 celebrated 125 years as a church.

**January 19, 2014** - the celebrations began with special guest speaker, Rev. Stefan Jonasson, who knew so much about the "odd" church of Underwood, its primary players and the influences it has had over time. We had special music including a choir of 12, special treats and sang songs from the original hymnal. We had almost a full house.

May 25. 2014 - Celebrants, Shannon Smith, Ellen Eastby and John Minge led the service to recognize and honor our members who came to UCU during the last century. Panel members included long time members: Ron Roller, Katy Olson, Kris and Wally Warhol; Gerald Ziesemer, Mary and Bob who described what the church was like for them covering the 70s, 80s, and 90s. Turn-out was great.

**August 30, 2014** – UCU participated in the Underwood Harvest Festival with a float in the parade, costumed portrayals of famous Unitarian-Universalists, open house at the church with music from our wonderful musicians, art works displayed by our many artists, a slide show presentation of our history, tours of the church and ice cream floats given to the many visitors.

Most of our fellowship participated by either working beforehand in preparation, greeting, driving the tractor, riding the float, dishing out ice cream, giving tours, narrating history or just being here and enjoying the day.

October 19, 2014 – Following Bob Worner's talk, "A Sense of Belonging" UU Principle #3 where he tied together so elegantly our 125 year celebrations and the meaning of our church, we had our first Progressive Dinner. Appetizers were served at church and then nearby homes were opened for the main course and desserts were served by other hosts on our way to our own homes with a total of 35 attending.

**December 28, 2014** – Kris Warhol and Norm Kolstad had assembled many pictures from the 125 years of the Unitarian Church of Underwood's history in time for its first showing at the Harvest Festival Open House in October. Norm has been described as an artist in his own right with the quality of the pictures he took for use in our church directory and other times. Kris and Norm shared and narrated their photo history with us, a really good ending to the 125th year's celebrations.

#### **Safety Plan Taskforce Report**

The UCU Board in November, 2014 determined the need for a Safety Plan for UCU and set up a Safety Plan Task Force (Mary Anderson, Norman Kolstad, Kris Warhol) to develop safety policies and procedures for the church. A Draft Safety Plan was presented to the Board March 18, 2015 and is currently under review. The Task Force is proposing establishment of a permanent Safety Committee comprised of at least five members and a 2015-2016 budget for safety equipment.

The purpose of the Safety Plan is to assure a safe church environment for UCU members, friends, visitors, employees and the public and safe-keeping of the church itself. The rationale, definitions and action procedures are defined under each category with a task list suggested for a potential Safety Committee. The Safety Plan is intended to be used by the UCU Board and the Safety Committee in conjunction with other committees. The following is the Plan outline:

#### **Stewardship Committee**

#### **Foundation Advisory Committee**

In July 2014 the board changed the name of the Planned Giving Committee to the Foundation Advisory Committee.

The Committee prepared a document called the Operational Guidelines of the Foundation of the Unitarian Church of Underwood. This document explains the purpose and accounts of the Foundation and the structure and function of the Foundation Advisory Committee. The document was approved by the Board at the August 2014 meeting.

At the annual meeting on April 19, 2015 the Committee will inform the congregation about the proposed formation of the UCU Foundation. It is the intent of the Board that the congregation will vote to determine if we proceed with the formation of the Foundation.
